## Terrorist military forces' strength and movement

- ✓ On November 7th, at 5:40 a.m., more than 30 members of terrorist military groups who left on foot from Pegyikhin in Nahtogyi Township, terrorist military groups and local defense forces clashed two miles away from Pyar village.
- ✓ They fired heavy weapons from the entrance of Pyar village. In the meantime, the terrorist military group, the police force, and the Pyusawhti (Informers) with over 70 forces attacked Pyar village in support of two (2) four-wheel vehicles and one light truck from Myingyan Township.



## 01 November 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023

As the column patrolled, the local fled to the Betel Farm, about 2 miles away from Pyar village, when a terrorist military group arrived and opened fire randomly at one people who were carrying children - injuring the mother in the shoulder and her 3-year-old daughter was hit in the head and died on the spot.

## 02 November 7<sup>th</sup>, 2023

Then, Mg Kyaw Min Thant, who was arrested from the Pyar village, as well as Ko Ye Win and Mg Htet Myat, who was arrested from Pyar village monastery. Furthermore, a total of five (5) people, were slaughtered and buried in a pile of cow dung, including Ko Gyitto (deaf) and Maung Pyae Phyo, who were arrested from Kunchantaw (Betel Farm). Their bodies were recovered on November 8.

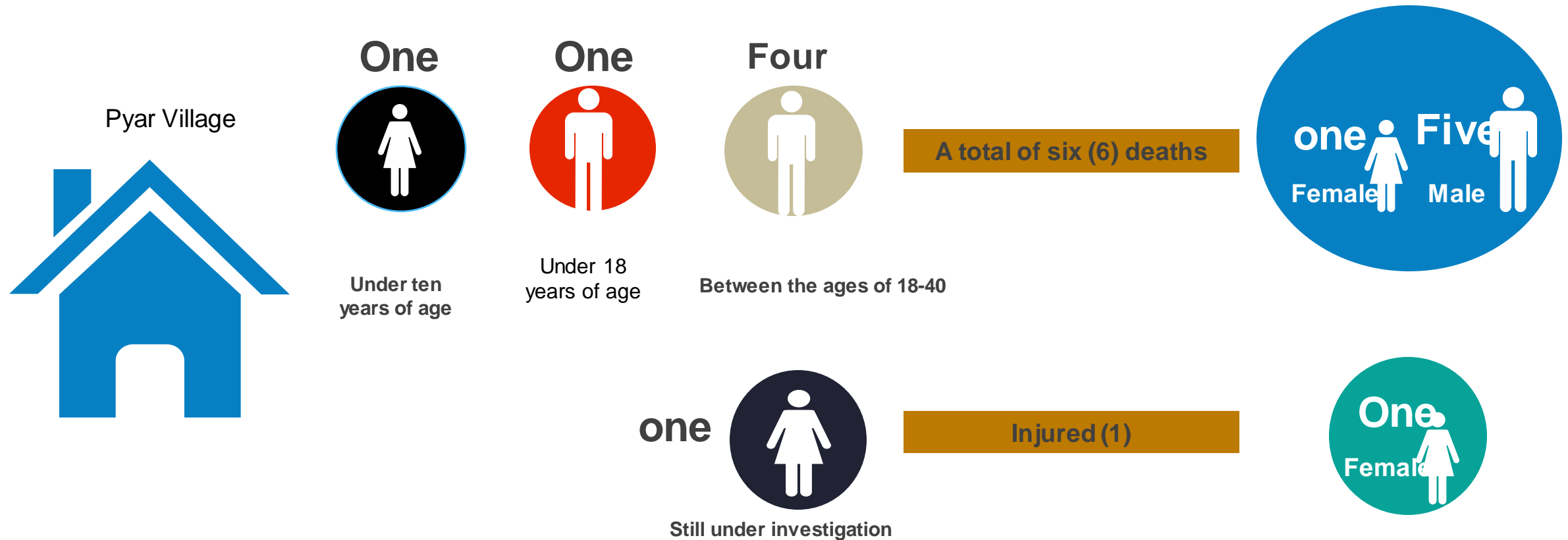
## 03 November 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023

The terrorist military group camped overnight at Yaelae monatery in Pyar village, and they took the women and children who were hiding in the North monastery and brought them to their camp as hostages. After burning of 37 houses in Pyar village, they left for KhansatGone vilalge, which is located about 7 furlongs south of Pyar

# Describes the gender and age groups of people killed or injured by terrorist military groups



The terrorist military group that burned down 370 houses killed six people and injured one. In October 2022, 67 (67) public houses in Pyar village were also burned down.
